REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee of the Town of Franklin:

In presenting my ninth annual report I wish to thank you for your support and helpfulness in the school work which has been a source of good will between us.

The citizens of the town in general have given their support in a sincere manner; their criticisms have been few and nearly always in a friendly way, and for this the school officials and teachers must always feel grateful. In this connection we may say that the citizens of a town can easily make or mar the efficiency of a school system by unkind and unfriendly criticism of the teachers and the methods of work on the one hand and by cordial cooperation on the other. The ideal condition is reached when the parents and patrons of the school become interested in the system and acquainted with the teachers enough to understand their ways of reaching the pupils so as to render effective aid in securing the sympathy of the children for the efforts of the teachers.

Every school should be a place where the parents may meet the teachers in the presence of their children without resentment on the part of either and may inspect the work with cordial feeling.

Parents, you can assist in securing better results by visiting your schools and by manifesting a greater degree of confidence and loyalty toward the teacher, by the cordial handclasp and kind and encouraging words.

If you will review the patience and vigor that it has cost you to train one child in the path he should go and call to mind

the numerous mistakes you probably have made you will appreciate the task of the teacher who has twenty-five or thirty pupils to lead.

Teachers are human, liable to mistakes as well as everybody else; think of the patience and energy which must be used by a teacher who has the management of a whole school.

Is it not surprising that teachers make so few errors under such conditions? I feel that one thing is lacking with our schools is a more earnest cooperation between the parents and the school.

During the fall term our schools were sadly interfered with on account of epidemics of measles and colds and I earnestly appeal to the parents to keep their children in school every day that is possible, that much of this loss may be overcome.

REPORT OF WORK BY THE HANCOCK COUNTY
HEALTH NURSE IN THE TOWN OF FRANKLIN
FOR THE YEAR OF 1928

This work is supported by the Christmas Seal Sale which amounted to \$46.25 and by town appropriation which was \$25.00 making in all for health work in Franklin for the year 1928, \$71.25.

Three schools had a full physical inspection for each pupil, the other schools had visits and inspections for various reasons mainly skin and contagious diseases. Forty children were inspected fully 11 of these needed glasses, 38 needed tooth corrections and 22 need care for nose and throat.

There was a Home Nursing class taught in the Farm Bureau Woman's Club.

There was a well baby conference, where babies were weighed and inspected and the mothers helped with the feeding and care of the little ones so that we may have better and stronger men and women in the future.

Citizens from Franklin had the advantages of the Heart, Asthma and Tuberculosis Clinic which was held at Ellsworth, May 1928. This clinic did not cost the town or those helped by it anything as it was free to all citizens of the county.

Home visits were made to the babies, children and others needing such care.

To S. A. Bragdon, a constable of the town of Franklin, in said county,

GREETING:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Franklin, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Franklin, on Monday, the eighteenth day of March, A. D. 1929, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said town meeting.
- Art 2 To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art 3 To hear and act on the reports of town officers for the past year.
- Art 4 To choose a board of selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art 5 To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.

- Art 6 To vote a percentage for collecting taxes, choose a collector of taxes, and make all necessary arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 7 To choose a town auditor.
- Art 8 To choose a town agent.
- Art 9 To choose one or more fire wardens, fix their compensation, and raise a sum of money for fire bills.
- Art 10 To choose a member of the school board to serve three years.
- Art 11 To choose or instruct the selectmen to appoint one or more road commissioners, fix their compensation and term of office.
- Art 12 To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of a free high school.
- Art 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools.
- Art 15 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for repairs of school buildings.
- Art 16 To raise a sum of money for the salary of the school board.
- Art 17 To raise a sum of money for the salary of superintendent of schools.
- Art 18 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for high school library.
- Art 19 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for high school equipment.
- Art 20 To raise a sum of money for the support of the poor.

- Art 21 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in section 19, chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art 22 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the improvement of the section of State-aid road, as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways and bridges.
- Art 23 To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money to be expended under the direction of E. C. D. West Post G. A. R. for the suitable observance of Memorial Day.
- Art 24 To raise a sum of money for the repairs of highways and bridges and make all necessary arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 25 To raise a sum of money for incidental expenses.
- Art 26 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to make temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- Art 27 To see if the town will vote to appropriate twenty five dollars for the graduating class of F. H. S.
- Art 28 To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for prizes for the boys' and girls' agricultural clubs of Franklin; and provide for spending the same.
- Art 29 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for town debt and interest.
- Art 30 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the salary of the sealer of weights and measures.
- Art 31 To raise a sum of money for street lights.

- Art 32 To raise a sum of money for repairs on town hall.
- Art 33 To raise a sum of money for removing future snow.
- Art 34 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for Mothers' Aid.
- Art 35 To see if the town will raise money to provide for the services of a public health nurse, or take any action thereon.
- Art 36 To see what price the town will decide to charge for rental of town hall.
- Art 37 To see what action the town will take in regard to housing town machinery, and raise a sum of money for same.
- Art 38 To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to issue alewife permits, and settle a price for same.
- Art 39 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on the Egypt Lane Road.
- Art 40 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on the George's Pond Road.
- Art 41 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended on the Clarence Hooper Road.
- Art 42 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to purchase a road machine, and make arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 43 To see if the town will vote to install a street light on Shipyard Point Road.
- Art 44 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended for advertising Maine.

- Art 45 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended in conjunction with the Cemetery Association to purchase an automobile hearse, and make arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 46 To see if the town will vote to re-establish State Patrol on highways.
- Art 47 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for insurance on town hall.
- Art 48 To raise a sum of money for maintenance of third class and special resolve roads.
- Art 49 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for cutting bushes on the town roads.
- Art 50 To see if the town will vote to require that all town orders be indorsed on the back by the payee before they are paid.
- Art 51 To act on any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at the town hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of meeting.
