REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the Superintending School Committee and town of Franklin:

To most of you I do not need to call attention to the excellent work of our teachers most of whom have won their reputation here in previous years.

In the high school Principal Noyes and Mrs. Wylie have not only been efficient, wide awake and tactful but have entered into the outside activities of the school and community. The records will show that an increase of transportation has helped the average attendance. Out of a registration of one hundred and thirty-three pupils in the grades last year the average was one hundred and ten, or about eighty five percent- a large increase over previous years.

Out of a fund of about three hundred dollars one school house has been painted this year and we believe the school house at the village, now housing about half of the grade pupils in town should be painted this year, as a matter of pride and preservation. There are other improvements which ought to be made in the near future that we probably cannot afford this year. The school board can point with pride to their careful expenditures of the school funds as each department shows a margin on the safe side and in conclusion, I wish to say that the satisfactory results both in growth of the schools and the financial condition have been due to the interest and splendid cooperation of the school board.

To C. A. Dyer, a constable of the town of Franklin, in said county.

Greeting:

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said town of Franklin, qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Town Hall in said Franklin, on Monday, the sixteenth day of March A. D. 1931, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to act on the following articles, to wit:

- Art 1 To choose a moderator to preside at said meeting.
- Art 2 To choose a town clerk for the ensuing year.
- Art 3 To hear and act on the reports of town officers for the past year.
- Art 4 To choose a board of selectmen, assessors and overseers of the poor for the ensuing year.
- Art 5 To choose a town treasurer for the ensuing year.
- Art 6 To vote a percentage for collecting taxes, choose a collector of taxes, and make all necessary arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 7 To choose a town auditor.
- Art 8 To choose a town agent.
- Art 9 To choose one or more fire wardens, fix their compensation, and raise a sum of money for fire bills.

- Art 10 To choose a member of the school board to serve three years.
- Art 11 To choose or instruct the selectmen to appoint one or more road commissioners, fix their compensation and term of office.
- Art 12 To choose all other necessary town officers.
- Art 13 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of a free high school.
- Art 14 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the support of common schools.
- Art 15 To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repairs of school buildings.
- Art 16 To raise a sum of money for the salary of the school-board.
- Art 17 To raise a sum of money for the salary of Superintendent of schools.
- Art 18 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for high school library.
- Art 19 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for high school equipment.
- Art 20 To raise a sum of money for the support of the poor.
- Art 21 To see if the town will vote "yes" or "no" on the question of raising money necessary to entitle the town to State Aid, as provided in Section 19, Chapter 25, of the Revised Statutes of 1916.
- Art 22 To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for the improvement of the section of State Aid Road, as outlined in the report of the State Highway Commission, in addition to the amount regularly raised for the care of ways and bridges.
- Art 23 To see what sum of money, if any, the town will vote to raise under Chapter No. 154, of the Public Laws of 1917 as amended by Chapter No. 157, of the Public Laws of 1919. For the construction of a State Aid Road, beginning at "Hancock Point" at "Youngs Store" to "Gallersons Corner" thence by way of third class road designation, to State Highway "N" (said

third class designation having been recinded) by State Highway No. 1 to Franklin Road, thence by route No. 182, through the towns of Hancock, Franklin, township No. 9, township No. 10, to Cherryfield Line, a distance of 25 miles or more.

- Art 24 To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money to be expended under the direction of E. C. D. West Post G. A. R. for the suitable observance of Memorial Day.
- Art 25 To raise a sum of money for the repairs of highways and bridges and make all necessary arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 26 To raise a sum of money for incidental expenses.
- Art 27 To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to make temporary loans in anticipation of taxes.
- Art 28 To see if the town will vote to appropriate \$25.00 for the graduating class of F. H. S.
- Art 29 To see if the town will vote to appropriate a sum of money for prizes for the boys and girls agricultural clubs of Franklin; and provide for spending the same.
- Art 30 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for town debt and interest.
- Art 31 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for the salary of the sealer of weights and measures.
- Art 32 To raise a sum of money for street lights.
- Art 33 To raise a sum of money for removing future snow.
- Art 34 To see if the town will raise a sum of money for Mother's Aid.
- Art 35 To see if the town will raise money to provide for the services of a public health nurse, or take any action thereon.
- Art 36 To see if the town will vote to instruct the selectmen to issue alewife permits, and settle a price for same.
- Art 37 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money to be expended for advertising Maine.

- Art 38 To see what action the town will take on the question of taking from the table Art. 2, of the Special town meeting Aug. 9 A. D. 1930, which was adjourned until the regular town meeting.
- Art 39 To see if the town will vote to raise \$392.00 for maintenance of third class and special resolve roads.
- Art 40 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of money for cutting bushes on town roads.
- Art 41 To see if the town will appropriate \$25.00 for the improvement of the road leading to and through the cemetery.
- Art 42 To see what action the town will take on buying a snow plow for truck, the cost of said plow not to exceed \$600.00
- Art 43 To see if the town will vote to sell the Egypt School House and make arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 44 To see if the town will vote to sell the Beechland School House, and make arrangements relating thereto.
- Art 45 To see if the town will vote to raise a sum of \$120.00 to purchase snow fence.
- Art 46 To act on any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

The selectmen hereby give notice that they will be in session for the purpose of revising and correcting the list of voters, at the town hall at nine o'clock in the forenoon on the day of said meeting.
