### COPY OF NOTICE RECEIVED FROM MAINE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE—LAWS RELATING TO DOGS—Title 7 Section 3702 as amended:

An emergency measure which became effective on February 15, 1974.

“The municipal officers of each municipality shall annually between January 1st and April 30th issue a warrant, returnable on October 15, following, to one or more police officers, constables or sheriff, directing him or them to proceed forthwith to enter complaint and summons to court the owner or keeper of any unlicensed dog. The said police officer, constable or sheriff shall, before entering such complaint and obtaining said summons, call on the owner or keeper of said dog and demand that he conform with the law and obtain a license from the Clerk within 7 days from the day of demand, paying to the clerk in addition to the license fee, an officer’s fee of



\$3, which the clerk shall pay over to the officer, unless said payment is otherwise provided for in the Municipal ordinance or charter.”

Owners or keepers of dogs six months old or over as of January 1, or at such time such dog becomes six months old, must procure a license annually. No license may be issued for such dog until the applicant has filed with the Clerk proof that such dog has been immunized against Rabies in accordance with rules and regulations set forth by the Commissioner of Health and Welfare.

The certificate must show that the date of immunization has been within 730 days (two years) preceding the date of application for the dog license.

## SCHOODIC COMMUNITY SCHOOL DISTRICT

### SCHOOL REPORT

To the citizens of Franklin, Sullivan, and Sorrento it is my pleasure to submit my first annual report as your superintendent of Schools.

Since your last annual report many changes have occurred. The Schoodic Community District has been formed to serve as the administrative unit to operate your elementary schools.

The plans to construct a new building to serve grades 6, 7, and 8 is progressing very well at this time. Included in this building are basic classrooms, a combination cafeteria, gymnasium, kitchen, space for Industrial Arts, Home Economics, Music, Special Education, Remedial and Corrective Reading programs. In addition to these, will be space for an Administrative office, Health clinic, Teachers room, and an instructional materials preparation room.

This new facility will make possible a much broader educational program for your students.

The location of the new school has been selected on Route 200 near the Franklin town line. Approval of this site by the various State Agencies is now in process. The State Department of Education and State Board of Education have given tentative approval for this new building.

The total cost of this new school building will be paid by the State. A new law passed by the current special session of the Legislature makes it unnecessary for the towns to raise money for school construction.

Barring unforeseen obstacles this school will be ready for opening in September 1975.

Additional projects that are scheduled to be completed this summer are the installation of new septic sewerage systems for the Sullivan and Franklin Grammar School.

Inasmuch as the change to a Community School District occurred during the middle of the year, some confusion may occur in the interpretation of your school financial reports. If my office can be of assistance in clarifying these, please contact us.

Another change which will occur because of the Community School District is that your towns will no longer raise and appropriate money for schools at their annual town meeting. A public District meeting will be held to transact all necessary business for your Elementary Schools.

I have found the staff of your schools well qualified and they are providing a quality educational program for your children.

Title I again this year is providing funds for a much needed remedial reading program. The program at Franklin was delayed because of insufficient funds. At this time, we are completing plans to initiate this service for Franklin to continue for the rest of the school year.

In closing I wish to express my appreciation to the staff of the schools, the school committee and citizens for the patience and cooperation they have shown during the brief time I have been your Superintendent.

## SCHOOL NURSE'S REPORT FOR UNION 96

January 1, 1973 — January 1, 1974

Before school opened this year, Dr. Christopher Mace was appointed school doctor to replace Dr. Silver who had numerous other commitments. It has been very helpful to have the services of the Gouldsboro Clinic for the school health program. Dr. Mace is also interested in health education, and now, that the required physicals are completed, more time will be spent in health instruction.

We are fortunate to have members of the Winter Harbor Naval Security Group who have offered their services. Dr. Maddox, Dental Officer, has met with me to plan a program in dental health education and topical fluoride applications. This had to be postponed last year due to the absence of a dentist to direct it. T. A. Grodzicki, who is in charge of Drug Abuse at the Navy Base, has put at our disposal several films and film strips, as well as his own services, for an up-to-date program in drug education. Some of the films have been previewed by the health council, nurse, and guidance director to ascertain opinions as to which ones would seem most effective at the high school level.

Oral Polio Vaccine boosters were offered to grades K-3, and 6 thru 12, last spring. I now have enough vaccine to supply those in the other grades, and permission slips have been sent home. Clinics were held in grades K-1-2 and 5 for any immunizations that were needed. A survey done by Department of Immunization Control showed children in our school system to be very well immunized.

This year the statute, making it compulsory for all children entering the school system to show evidence of having had a physical during the past six months, became effective in September. I attended all school regis-

trations, explained this law to parents, and gave them a form for the physicians report. There are only nine kindergarten children in the Union who have not returned the completed forms. Notices have been sent home to remind parents of this requirement. Next spring, I plan to do vision and hearing tests on children at registration. In this way, parents will have an opportunity to get treatment for any defects before the child enters school in September.

Tuberculosis testing was done on all school personnel, and students assisting with food handling, when necessary. Those who had a positive test were referred for x-rays. No evidence of active tuberculosis was found as a result of these.

Films and talks on several phases of health and maturation will again be used in appropriate grades. A dental health program, with topical flouride applications in the classroom, is already planned with the assistance of Dr. Maddox and the health council.

Teachers have been most prompt in calling me to check on children with significant injuries or abnormal conditions. Each school has one person assigned to take care of minor bruises and scrapes when I am not available. I would appreciate it if parents, who take children from school to a doctor for treatment, would notify me of the results so that I have a record of it.

Again I would like to thank the administration staff, teachers, parents, and Dr. Mace and his associates for their cooperation and help. It is most rewarding to have suggestions or recommendations accepted and requests granted so graciously.

## FRANKLIN CONSOLIDATED SCHOOL

There has been much less trouble with head lice in the school this year. With the help of the town Health Office, Katherine Townley, a check of the entire student body was done the week after school opened. Children from six different families were found to be infested. Parents were instructed on how to treat and was given where needed. Since this initial problem, it seems to be under control with periodical checks.

Physicals by Dr. Cushman have been done on 40 students in grades, 5, 6, 7, and 8 who either play basketball or cheer. These students were bussed to the nurse's office at Sumner where it was much more convenient to do the examinations.

I attended registration for children entering school last fall and urged parents to take children to their family doctor for required physicals. Also I was able to get a more complete health and immunization history for school records. All children in the first grade have been taken for physicals and reports returned to the nurse.

Vision and hearing tests have been done on all students in grades 1, 2, 3, 5, and 7. Five were found to have uncorrected vision problems. These were referred for examinations by an optometrist. The results of fall examination showed 32 with cavities and 8 with grossly enlarged tonsils. T. B. Tests were done on 5 of the personnel and 8 students.

Immunization clinics will be held later for those needing initial or booster shots. Requests for Oral Polio boosters have been sent to parents of students in grades 4, 5, 6, who were not given it last year.

## COMMENTS

### Town of Franklin

March 1, 1972 to March 1, 1973

An audit has been completed of the financial records of the Town of Franklin for the fiscal year ended March 1, 1973. This audit included an examination of the records maintained by the Assessors, Selectmen, Treasurer, Tax Collector and Town Clerk.

The examination included a review of cash transactions as well as an analysis of available funds and expenditures. The result of the year's operation of the departmental accounts revealed that available funds exceeded expenditures by \$4,054.88:

#### Assets

The cash balance of \$9,734.75 was reconciled with the bank statements furnished by the Union Trust Company, Ellsworth, Maine.

Other assets, including accounts receivable, taxes, tax liens and tax acquired property were reviewed. Unpaid accounts were reconciled with the balance shown on the records of the Selectmen.

#### Liabilities

Total general fund liabilities amounted to \$3,132.20 which represented accounts payable of \$2,600.00 and \$532.20 due Trust Funds.

## **Reserves and Surplus**

The appropriation accounts reflect unexpended balances of \$6,100.40 which are being carried forward to the ensuing year.

The unappropriated surplus amounted to \$6,051.98 as compared with \$8,732.44 at the close of the prior year. An analysis of this change is shown on Exhibit E.

## **Trust Funds**

An examination of the various funds held in trust by the Town revealed that the principal of these funds amounted to \$8,850.00 and unexpended income \$577.88. These funds were legally invested with the exception of \$532.20 in the general fund.

## **Scope of Audit**

Count of cash was made and records checked to determine the accuracy of recording cash transactions. The system of internal control was reviewed as pertained to the handling of cash and other matters of financial concern. Receipts, vouchers and cancelled checks were examined for a selected period and major increases or decreases in revenue or expenditures over previous years were explored.

The fidelity bonds of the various Town officials were examined and found in order.

Revenue attained from the excise taxes were checked with the receipts retained by the Collector and found to be accounted for and properly recorded.

Vouchers and payrolls were examined in part and those examined appeared to be proper charges to the accounts involved.

Various laws pertaining to the fiscal operations of the

municipality were reviewed to determine that related financial transactions were properly administered.

### GREETINGS

In the name of the State of Maine, you are hereby directed to notify and warn the inhabitants of said Town of Franklin qualified by law to vote in town affairs, to meet at the Grange Hall in said Franklin on Monday, the 18th day of March A. D. 1974 at 10:30 in the morning to act on the following articles, to wit:

### ARTICLE:

1. To choose a Moderator to preside at said meeting.
2. To elect all necessary town officers by secret ballot. The polls for voting on Article 2 will be open at 10:30 in the forenoon and will close at 6 o'clock in the afternoon. The business meeting to act on the following articles will open at 7:30 in the evening the same day.
3. To hear and act on the reports of town officers.
4. To fix the compensation of the elected town officials.

5. To vote a percentage for collecting taxes and make all necessary arrangements relating thereto.
