Ref: LETTER FROM STATE BUREAU OF TAXATION, 1990 tax year

The State has mandated two options for the Town to follow in regards to valuation for the 1990 tax year:

1. Acceptance of the State leveled \$39 million valuation (as opposed to the \$23 million set locally), or
2. Appeal.

Our Options, slim to none.

In 1987 we had a 100% ratio. We valued ourselves at \$22 million, the State did the same. Now in 1990 we are at a 59% ratio. This being caused by land at Dwelley Point selling at \$40,000. per acre, land on the ponds selling for \$100. per foot, land on Route 200N selling for \$10,000. per acre and on and on.

There are two ways to increase valuation, neither are popular.

1. A blanket over-all increase of 40%, or
2. Increasing the five basic types of tax producing properties by varying percentages.

These properties being - 1. water frontage (fresh and salt), 2. house lots, 3. buildings, 4. raw acreage and 5. personal property. This of course amounts to a revaluation. Once valuations are increased the mill rate will come down - at least for the time being.

The intent of this notice is to inform you the tax payer what is in the works.

Re: 1989 Assessment Standards

Dear Mr. Carter:

A review of our records reveals that Franklin has failed to meet the 70% minimum ratio requirement as mandated by Title 36, MRSA §327, sub-§1.

The 1989 assessment standards ratio is calculated by dividing a municipality's 1989 total municipal valuation by its 1990 State Valuation. For Franklin this ratio is 59.07.

Section 329, Title 36 provides that, upon receipt of this determination, Franklin has two options:

1. Acceptance. Franklin may notify this office in writing of its acceptance of the Bureau's determination. At that time, a meeting will be scheduled between the municipality and the Bureau to discuss methods by which the Town might regain compliance with the assessment standards.
2. Appeal. Franklin may appeal this determination to the State Board of Property Tax Review in accordance with the provisions of Title 36, MRSA §272.

Your written reply is requested on or before April 6, 1990. Please contact the undersigned if you have any questions concerning this determination.

Attention to all Dog Owners or Keepers: Licenses are due on or before January 1 of every year on all dogs six months old or older, or when dogs become six months old. A certificate of proof that dog has been immunized against Rabies must show date within 730 days (two years), presented when applying for license, and only uniform Rabies Certificates shall be honored.

Under State Law (Section 3702) a fee of \$4.00 extra must be paid by Dog Owner if license has to be collected by authorized Animal Control Officer.

Compliance with Laws, regulations, contracts, and grants applicable to the Town of Franklin, Maine, is the responsibility of the Town of Franklin, Maine's management. As part of our audit, we assessed the risk that noncompliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grants could cause the financial statements to be materially misstated. We concluded that the risk of such material misstatement was sufficiently low that it was not necessary to perform tests of the town's compliance with such provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grants.

However, in connection with our audit, nothing came to our attention that caused us to believe that Franklin, Maine had not complied in all material respects, with the laws, regulations, contracts, and grants referred to in the preceding paragraph.

This report is intended for the information of the management of the Town of Franklin, Maine. This restriction is not intended to limit the distribution of the report, which is a matter of public record.

SCHOOL COMMITTEE REPORT

Dear Franklin Citizens

Your school committee is aware that the issue of dissolution has won attention of most Franklin Residents. It has been controversial and lead to much division in our town. Charges and counter-charges have the papers. Often, the debate seems to have centered on persona rather than educational issues.

Our report to you is on the issues of education as we see them. We do believe Schoodic CSD is a successful school system. The education of the last decade identified numerous problems in American education needed correcting. Regrettably, many of those problems continue unabated in Schoodic.

The district lacks a sequential, unified curriculum. Instruction is heavily weighted towards process, lacking an essential balance between process and content. The district does not have a commitment to library-resource services. There is no clear philosophy of educational excellence but rather an attitude of "we'll muddle through." Test scores are below average and continue to decline. Despite a disagreeable construction project, completed less than a year ago, administrators now are speaking space shortages. At the last School Board meeting a major topic discussion was closing the library and possibly utilizing some space in Sullivan Grammar School.

For over ten years Franklin citizens have worked to get a curriculum provide and strengthen a library and implement needed reforms. The response of the other two Towns has been defensive, hostile and a total of concern based on their voting majority.

Given this situation, we see very little hope for making Schoodic the rate school system we all want. Quite frankly, Schoodic students have been short changed.

As a result, we support dissolution of the district. We know this will present some hardships for Franklin. Our educational goals will not be achieved overnight. We believe we can build a better school system, one that meets the academic and vocational needs of the future, strives for excellence and sheds the mediocrity of the past. For the future of our children, it is time to leave Schoodic and its problems behind.

PLANNING BOARD

This has been a very busy year for the Planning Board. "The Subdivision Ordinance of the Town of Franklin" was adopted at Town Meeting last year. The Ordinance has been a great help in regulating the process of reviewing subdivision applications. As with any new ordinance, we have found a few items which need minor changes. We have proposed amendments to the ordinance that the Town will be asked to adopt this year at Town Meeting.

The past year we have granted one special exception permit for a Mobile Home Park. We have denied one special exception permit for a public utility. The Board has granted three subdivision permits on Route 200 North, two subdivision permits on Route 200 South, one subdivision permit at Great Pond, one subdivision permit on the Cherryfield Road, and one subdivision permit on Butler Point. At this time we have two subdivision applications that have not been completed or returned.

This year, at Town Meeting, the Town will be asked to amend the bylaws of the Franklin Planning Board. The current bylaws were adopted in 1972 when the Planning Board was formed. In the past eighteen years the state guidelines for Planning Board bylaws have changed so we need to update our bylaws to meet the states current requirements.

37. To see what sum the Town will raise and/or appropriate for Community Health Counseling Services. Requested: \$808.50.

38. To see if the Town will raise and/or appropriate \$2,000. to start a capital reserve fund for the future purchase of a fire truck.
(Budget Committee recommends "yes".)
39. To see if the Town will raise and/or appropriate \$1,474. for the Maine Municipal Association Casualty Insurance.
(Budget Committee recommends "yes".)
40. To see if the Town will raise and/or appropriate \$1,000. for Alexander & Alexander Public Officials' Liability Insurance.
(Budget Committee recommends "yes".)
41. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate \$125. for Action Opportunities, Inc. to support Head Start Program.
(Budget Committee makes no recommendation.)
42. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and/or appropriate in support of Northeast Combat
(Budget Committee makes no recommendation.)
43. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and/or appropriate in support of the American Cancer Society.
(Budget Committee makes no recommendation.)
44. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and/or appropriate in support of Special Children's Friends, Inc.
(Budget Committee makes no recommendation.)
45. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and/or appropriate in support of Down East Aids Network.
(Budget Committee makes no recommendation.)
46. To see what sum of money the Town will raise and/or appropriate in support of Downeast Transportation, Inc. Requested: \$330.
(Budget Committee makes no recommendation.)

47. Shall the Town establish official scheduled office hours at the Town Hall, for the Tax Collector, the Excise Tax Collector, and the Town Clerk, to be not less than 4 hours per week per office, commencing April 1, 1991.
48. To see if the Town will accept a gift from the inhabitants of Rabbittown, a neighborhood in northeast Franklin, of a glass-doored bulletin board, to be hung on the outside wall of the Town Office, said board to be designated as one of the official locations for posting notices of all public meetings, with time, date, location and agenda, 7 days in advance, as required by law.
49. To see if the Town will direct the Selectmen to notify all organizations with no place of business in Franklin who are seeking funds to be raised at Town Meetings, that after April 1, 1990, articles for the town warrant will only be accepted by petition as provided for by law, under Title 30-A Section 2522, which is a written petition of a number of voters equal to at least 10% of the number of votes cast in the last gubernatorial election and advise them of the number of signatures required and the deadline for inclusion in the warrant for town meeting.
50. To see what action, if any, the Town wishes to take in regards to the following:

Whereas recycling is a wise and prudent solid waste management technique that saves tipping fees, extends the life of land-fills, saves energy, reduces pollution and environmental degradation, keeps usable manufacturing materials in the economy, and signifies a developing sense of waste awareness, therefore, the Town of Franklin wishes to encourage recycling to the maximum extent possible.
51. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with Maine Waste Management Agency, and Coastal Recycling, to accept a grant in the amount of \$200,000.; to appropriate the grant money for the purposes provided for in the contract; and to raise and appropriate \$9,456. as the Town's portion of the local matching share of the project costs also to be expended for the purposes provided in the contract.
52. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to enter into a contract with Coastal Recycling to provide recycling services for the Town, and to appropriate \$7,000. or some assessed portion thereof as the Town's share of the annual administration costs, also to be expended for the purpose provided in the contract.
53. To see if the Town will direct the Selectmen to appoint a Recycling Manager, to supervise the assets and efforts of the Town's recycling program, said Manager to be compensated at the rate of \$750. per year and the position to be filled by yearly election starting in 1991.
54. To see what action the Town will take concerning the Water Department.

55. To see if the Town will raise and/or appropriate \$500. for the Franklin Farm Team (comprising about 20 players) to provide them with the needed uniforms and equipment.
56. To see if the Town will raise and/or appropriate \$500. for the G.I. Mapping Service, to revise and update the Comprehensive Plan for the Town.
57. Shall the Town vote to accept a Planning Grant as provided by the Maine State Legislature, to raise the local funds required as a match to the grant, to appropriate the grant and required local matching funds for the development of a comprehensive plan pursuant to the Comprehensive Planning and Land Use Regulation Act, to authorize the Selectmen to contract with the State Department of Economic and Community Development for the grant, and to authorize the selectmen to contract, as necessary, for materials and services needed to achieve the purposes of the grant?

INFORMATION: Estimated amount of grant: \$12,643.00
 Estimated amount of local match: 4,214.00

58. To see if the Town will vote to amend the bylaws of the Franklin Planning Board, as enacted August 17, 1972 Section II, Subsection D, to read as follows:

D. When there is a permanent vacancy, the municipal officers shall, within 60 days of its occurrence, appoint a person to serve for the unexpired term. A vacancy shall occur upon the resignation or death of any member, or when a member fails to attend four (4) consecutive regular meetings, or fails to attend at least 75% of all meetings during the preceding twelve (12) month period. When a vacancy occurs, the chairperson of the board shall immediately so advise the municipal officers in writing. The board may recommend to the municipal officers that the attendance provision be waived for cause, in which case no vacancy will then exist until the municipal officers disapprove the recommendation. The municipal officers may remove members of the planning board by unanimous vote, for cause, after notice and hearing.

AMENDMENTS TO SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE

[as specified in Article 59 of the Town Warrant]

ARTICLE 59: To see if the Town will vote to amend "The Subdivision Ordinance of the Town of Franklin, Maine" as enacted March 25, 1989 to read as follows:

Page 7 Section III Subsection E: Public Hearing

1. Public Hearing shall be mandatory:
The Planning Board shall hold such hearing within thirty (30) days of having received a completed subdivision application.
2. Notification:
The Planning Board shall cause notice of the date, time, and place of such hearing to be given, by regular mail, to the applicant and all abutting property owners, within 500 feet, of the proposed subdivision.
3. Public Notice:
The Planning Board shall cause public notice of the date, time, and place of the public hearing for the proposed subdivision to be published at least two (2) times in a newspaper of general circulation in the Franklin area. The date of the first publication shall be at least seven (7) days prior to the hearing.

Page 10 Section IV Subsection M: Commercial lots require a conditional use permit.

The following commercial uses may be allowed only upon the review and authorization of a conditional use permit by the Planning Board:

1. Home occupations of a non-hazardous, non-pollutant nature; and
2. Commercial businesses of a non-hazardous, non-pollutant nature.

Page 11 Section V Subsection B: Roads to be accessible for public safety equipment.

Proposed subdivision roads shall be designed and constructed so that they are sufficient to afford a reasonable means of ingress and egress for public safety equipment and emergency vehicles.

1. Road Width:
The minimum road surface width, of the travel way and the surface of both shoulders, level with the travel way, shall be twenty (20) feet.

2. Turn arounds:

Any dead end road longer than 400 feet must have one of the following types of turn arounds:

- a. Circular turn arounds with a travel surface of at least 100 feet in diameter.
- b. Right angle turn arounds shall be a minimum of 40 feet deep (from the edge of the travel way on the adjacent shoulder), a minimum of 20 feet wide at the rear, and a minimum of 30 feet wide at the mouth.
- c. Any road more than $\frac{1}{2}$ mile in length shall have a minimum of one of the above turn arounds, for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ mile a portion thereof, for every or other alternative, approved by the Planning Board.

3. Minimum right of way:

The minimum right of way for all subdivision roads shall be fifty (50) feet.

Page 12 Section VIII Subsection A:

Reverse the order of Articles 1 and 2. Article 2 will become Article 1 and Article 1 will become Article 2, as a means of putting the steps in the proper sequence.

- c. Any road more than $\frac{1}{2}$ mile in length shall have a minimum of one of the above turn arounds, and one for every additional $\frac{1}{2}$ mile or portion thereof, every other alternative must be approved by the Planning Board.
